**APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF SCE'S "CHANGE A LIGHT, CHANGE THE
WORLD," COMPACT FLUORESCENT LAMP PROGRAM**

I.

INTRODUCTION

In accordance with Rule 3.2 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure (Rules) of the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission or CPUC), Southern California Edison Company (SCE) hereby files this application requesting expedited treatment and approval of its program plans, budget, and ratemaking treatment for SCE's "Change A Light, Change The World," Compact Fluorescent Lamp (CFL) Program for 2007 and 2008 (Application) which SCE anticipates implementing by July 1, 2007. Concurrent with the filing of this Application, SCE is filing an advice letter on an expedited basis seeking authority to create a memorandum account to track costs associated with the implementation of SCE's "Change A Light, Change The World," CFL Program (CFL Program).

The concurrently-served supporting testimony, set forth in what has been preliminarily marked for identification as Exhibit SCE-1, discusses the specific program strategy for the CFL Program for 2007 and 2008 and includes a detailed budget proposal, estimated energy savings impacts, and proposed ratemaking treatment.

II.

ORGANIZATION OF SCE'S TESTIMONY

The testimony served in support of this Application consists of five sections.

Section I is introductory in nature and discusses the context and background for this filing, along with a short summary of SCE's requests. Gene E. Rodrigues is sponsoring the testimony for this section.

Section II sets forth SCE's CFL Program proposal, including a detailed description of the estimated budgets and planned administrative activities for the program. John F. Nall is sponsoring the testimony for this section.

Section III sets forth SCE's measurement and evaluation work related to the CFL Program. Marian V. Brown is sponsoring the testimony for this section.

Section IV discusses SCE's proposed ratemaking treatment for SCE's CFL Program. Jill Holmes is sponsoring the testimony for this section.

Section V summarizes and concludes SCE's requests for its CFL Program. John F. Nall is sponsoring the testimony for this section.

III.

SUMMARY OF SCE'S REQUEST

In this Application, SCE requests Commission approval of SCE's proposals, which will allow SCE to implement its CFL Program which is expected to generate 280.6 million kilowatt-

hours of annual energy savings,¹ 23.7 MW of demand reduction² and 156,700 CO₂ tons of emission reductions,³ which is the equivalent of removing nearly 30,000 cars off California roads.⁴

SCE applauds the Commission for leading the way by initiating a statewide planning process to investigate and pursue Big Bold energy efficiency initiatives to meet California's resource planning and climate change goals. SCE believes the model it is proposing herein for low income neighborhoods is responsive to the Commission's leadership and also presents a model that can be expanded within the Commission's forthcoming Big Bold strategies initiative. With this in mind, SCE looks forward to working side-by-side with the Commission and all other interested stakeholders during that process which will inform the 2009-11 program cycle. In the meantime, however, given the significant immediate benefits that will accrue to low income customers who need bill savings now, the resource benefits and greenhouse gas reductions that can be captured immediately for California, the timely leveraging opportunity provided by the national ENERGY STAR® "Change A Light, Change The World" campaign, and reductions in the CARE subsidy that will benefit all ratepayers in the future through reductions in energy consumption by low income customers participating in this program, SCE believes that it is appropriate to request CPUC approval for SCE's "Change a Light, Change the World," CFL Program now.

SCE's proposed CFL Program will set the standard in California for national participation in the ENERGY STAR® "Change A Light, Change The World" campaign in

which customers sign a pledge to install at least one CFL in their home. The CFL Program is intended to place the most cost effective and most practical energy-saving appliance in the hands of those customers most in need of bill savings. Through the CFL Program, SCE plans to reach one million homes in low income neighborhoods with an offer to provide six CFLs per home at no cost to the household in return for a customer pledge to immediately remove existing incandescent bulbs and replace them with the CFLs. SCE's CFL Program will fund a household-to-household neighborhood outreach campaign directed at low income neighborhoods throughout SCE's service territory. SCE will partner with community-based organizations to offer six CFL bulbs to each targeted home, with the goal of reaching 926,000 homes, in addition to providing two additional CFLs to the 74,000 households⁵ currently planned for treatment under SCE's existing 2007-8 Low Income Energy Efficiency (LIEE) program, for a total of one million homes reached. SCE plans to reach such one million homes by December 31, 2008. Accordingly, SCE is hereby seeking approval of a \$22.000 million CFL Program budget to implement the program.

Compared to revenues at present rates of \$11,613 million, SCE is requesting a revenue increase of approximately \$22 million, or 0.19 percent, for 2008. The percentage of increase in total revenue is less than one percent. The following table shows an estimate of proposed

A. Approval of SCE’s CFL Program Administrative Costs and Budget

In its supporting testimony, SCE has set forth detailed descriptions of its proposed CFL Program administrative activities planned for 2007 and 2008 by expenditure category, along with the estimated budget allocation of each category. The budget will support aggressive outreach and marketing strategies recommended for success in delivering this new program and will result in immediate energy savings, bill savings, and greenhouse gas reductions. Actual costs for the CFLs will not be known until responses to a competitive solicitation have been received from suppliers. SCE needs flexibility to adjust the proposed budget allocations to ensure that the CFL Program design can be modified as necessary to ensure successful implementation. To this end, SCE requests that it be permitted to shift funding among the various budget categories of the CFL Program. SCE also requests that any remaining unspent funds be carried into the existing, or future, LIEE program budget for the installation of its particular measures.

In summary, SCE respectfully requests approval of its proposed CFL Program budget of \$22.000 million to implement the program. SCE has included a detailed program budget in Appendix A of its supporting testimony.

B. Adoption of SCE's Ratemaking Proposal

As discussed in the supporting ratemaking testimony, SCE's current ratemaking associated with LIEE includes: 1) the recovery of the Commission-authorized LIEE revenue requirement through the operation of the Public Purpose Programs Adjustment Mechanism (PPPAM), and 2) the comparison of the authorized LIEE revenue requirements with actually-incurred LIEE expenses in the Low-Income Energy Efficiency Programs Adjustment Mechanism (LIEEPAM).

SCE proposes to recover the authorized CFL Program expenses through its existing non-bypassable Public Purpose Programs Charge (PPPC), which applies to all of SCE's retail customers.⁶ Authorized revenue requirement associated with the 2007-2008 CFL Program will be combined with the currently authorized 2007-2008 LIEE revenue requirement and will be recorded in the PPPAM. To ensure that SCE recovers neither more nor less than its authorized 2007-2008 LIEE revenue requirement (including the authorized 2007-2008 CFL Program revenue requirement), SCE will record a monthly debit entry equal to one-twelfth of the annual authorized revenue requirement in the CPUC Public Purpose Programs subaccount of the PPPAM.

Through the operation of the LIEEPAM, SCE compares the authorized LIEE revenue requirement with actual LIEE expenses. Authorized CFL Program revenue requirement and expenses will be recorded in the LIEEPAM. The balance recorded in the LIEEPAM is carried over from one year to the next.

In order to reduce the number of rate changes, the Commission has established the annual Energy Resource Recovery Account (ERRA) Forecast proceeding as the proper place to consolidate all Commission-authorized revenue requirement changes into one rate level change. In SCE's annual August 1st ERRA Forecast applications, SCE sets forth its consolidated revenue

requirement for the subsequent year. SCE proposes to include the CFL Program revenue requirement approved in this proceeding in PPC rate levels on or after January 1, 2008 as part of its 2008 ERRA⁷ Forecast proceeding revenue requirement and rate consolidation. This rate consolidation will include the true-up of any undercollection that may accrue due to the time lag between implementing the CFL Program revenue requirement and actually reflecting the CFL Program revenue requirement in rate levels.

Concurrently with the filing of this application, SCE is submitting an advice letter requesting Commission authorization to establish the Compact Fluorescent Light Program Memorandum Account (CFLPMA). If approved, SCE will record in the CFLPMA the CFL expenses incurred prior to the approval of this application. Upon a final Commission decision in this proceeding authorizing SCE to implement the CFL Program and recovery of the increased LIEE revenue requirement, SCE will transfer the amount recorded in the CFLPMA to the LIEEPAM.

SCE respectfully requests the adoption of its ratemaking proposals for the CFL Program.

IV.

STATUTORY AND PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS

A. Statutory and Procedural Authority

This Application is made pursuant to the Commission's Rules and the California Public Utilities Code.

SCE's authority for this request includes, but is not limited to, Sections 382, 399.2, 399.9, 451, 491, 701 and 702 of the California Public Utilities Code, and prior decisions, orders and resolutions of this Commission.

SCE's request complies with Rules 1.5 through 1.11 and 1.13, which specify the procedures for the filing of documents.⁸ In addition, this request complies with Rules 2.1, 2.2 and 3.2.

B. Rule 2.1(c)

Rule 2.1(c) requires that applications shall state “[t]he proposed category for the proceeding, the need for hearing, the issues to be considered, and a proposed schedule.” These requirements are discussed below.

C. Proposed Categorization

SCE proposes to characterize this proceeding as “ratesetting” as defined in Rule 1.3(e).

D. Need for Hearing and Proposed Schedule for Resolution of Issues

If no party objects to SCE's proposed 2007 and 2008 CFL Program plans, hearings may not be needed on any of the issues addressed in this Application. SCE's proposals submitted herein and set forth in the supporting testimony constitute a sufficient record for the Commission to rule on SCE's CFL Program plans and budgets without the need for evidentiary hearings. SCE believes that all interested parties can comment and express their views through written protests and comments. If evidentiary hearings are deemed unnecessary, SCE respectfully requests that a final decision is rendered before July 1, 2007.

If hearings are deemed necessary, however, SCE requests that such proceedings be expedited and the schedule be designed and maintained so that a final decision will be rendered as soon as practical or, in the alternative, before September 14, 2007. As discussed above, SCE is filing an advice letter concurrently herewith requesting authority to create a memorandum account to track costs associated with the initial implementation of the CFL Program. SCE also

respectfully requests that a portion, if not all, of such proceedings be held in Southern California so that interested parties in SCE's service territory will have the opportunity to participate.

The issues to be considered in this Application concern Commission approval of SCE's proposed 2007 and 2008 CFL Program administrative activities, program plans, and budgets, and SCE's proposed ratemaking treatment of these costs.

- ◆ Approval of the proposed ratemaking treatment; and

- ♦ Granting such other relief as the Commission finds just and reasonable.
